Saying Sorry (optional – include a children's sorry prayer)

Saying Sorry

We bring all that is sin - all that we have done wrong - to God for his forgiveness.

Keep your eyes open and

- *Make a fist* We are sorry for the times we have got angry with other people.
- Point away from yourself with your index finger We are sorry for the times we have blamed others and seen things wrong in others without recognising how much is also wrong in us.
- Close up your hand and hold it close to your chest We are sorry for the times we have kept things selfishly to ourselves and not been prepared to give to those who need our help.
- Put your hand over your mouth We are sorry for the foolish words we have spoken which have hurt other people.
- Put your hand over your eyes We are sorry that we have deliberately chosen not to see the good things we could have done to help other people.
- Put your hand over one ear We are sorry for the times we have not listened to the cries of those who are poor or who suffer injustice.

After a pause ask everyone to hold out that same hand with an open palm upward, as if they are waiting to receive something. Use words such as:

Jesus says, 'If you are tired from carrying heavy burdens, come to me and I will give you rest'. So we bring all that we are to Jesus - all our sins and our failure to love. Thank-you that you died for us so that we might be forgiven and start a new life in the power of your Holy Spirit.

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Reading - Romans 11:1-2a, 29-32

The Remnant of Israel

11 I ask then: Did God reject his people? By no means! I am an Israelite myself, a descendant of Abraham, from the tribe of Benjamin. ² God did not reject his people, whom he foreknew. Don't you know what Scripture says in the passage about Elijah—how he appealed to God against Israel:

²⁹ for God's gifts and his call are irrevocable. ³⁰ Just as you who were at one time disobedient to God have now received mercy as a result of their disobedience, ³¹ so they too have now become disobedient in order that they too may now receive mercy as a result of God's mercy to you. ³² For God has bound everyone over to disobedience so that he may have mercy on them all.

- ²¹ Leaving that place, Jesus withdrew to the region of Tyre and Sidon. ²² A Canaanite woman from that vicinity came to him, crying out, "Lord, Son of David, have mercy on me! My daughter is demon-possessed and suffering terribly."
- ²³ Jesus did not answer a word. So his disciples came to him and urged him, "Send her away, for she keeps crying out after us."
- ²⁴ He answered, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of Israel."
- ²⁵ The woman came and knelt before him. "Lord, help me!" she said.
- ²⁶ He replied, "It is not right to take the children's bread and toss it to the dogs."
- ²⁷ "Yes it is, Lord," she said. "Even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their master's table."
- ²⁸ Then Jesus said to her, "Woman, you have great faith! Your request is granted." And her daughter was healed at that moment.

Reflection Time

Short Reflection by Revd Capt Clive Deverell

The Canaanite woman changes everything, this for me is one of the most important pieces of scripture in the Bible.

I would go as far as to say after the major festivals, we should be celebrating this day more than any other. This passage follows just a few paragraphs after the feeding of the five thousand. If we take the link to leftovers after the feeding of the five thousand there was enough left over twelve baskets. An oblique reference, I believe to the twelve tribes of Israel.

Here in this discourse this gentile woman says the dogs, eat even the crumbs, she saw Jesus as someone also for her, a gentile. She believed her daughter would be healed. If only Jesus would say, and do what he had already done for the Jewish people.

"I was sent only to the lost of Israel" (those twelve tribes) is his reply to her request.

However, she pleads, she begs, but most importantly she points out that crumbs fall to the floor.

This is a stunning image of a woman who is desperate, but also one who deep down knows who Jesus is.

Jesus could have responded negatively but if we look back to the feeding of the Five thousand, he had "pity" on those who had followed him.

He again he cared, he had empathy, so what is he to do?

The response so far to Jesus from the people of Israel had been patchy, some followed, but others certainly those in authority were already plotting his demise. She has compared herself and her kind (the gentiles, to dogs) in such a belittling way.

Here in this moment Jesus's ministry changes.

He recognises, His love, God's love, changes everything for all peoples, not just the people of Israel.

Those who reach out to him whatever creed, colour, background now have access to that life changing love of God. The woman's daughter is healed, and as a consequence you and I now have access.

Access to what ? To God! With it a life changing relationship with Jesus, it is a relationship which for us gentiles all became possible because of this woman who pleaded, and begged Jesus to recognise that his love, God's love could change everything for all peoples. That is certainly worth celebrating.
